



Toyin Ojih Odutola Becomes 3rd Highest Selling Nigerian Artist Of All Time.

US based Nigerian artist, Toyin Ojih Odutola, has made history by becoming the third highest selling Nigerian Artist of all time. She has gained a lot of popularity over the years for her pen ink drawings, which raise pertinent questions about the construct of blackness.

Having moved from Nigeria to America at the age of five, Ojih Odutola became aware of her blackness and began questioning her true identity. She made use of art as a coping mechanism, and over time, it transformed into an "*investigative, learning activity*" for her.

"I was obsessed, capturing everything I saw and being fascinated with the incredibly simple task of looking at something and transmitting it onto paper. It's an immediate magic."

At the Sotheby's on Thursday, Toyin sold one of her fantastic drawings, titled '*Compound Leaf*', for £471,000 (roughly N215 million), making her the *3rd highest selling Nigerian artist of all time* – behind fellow female artist, Njideka Akunyili Crosby, and the legendary Ben Enwonwu.




